Dress Code Reminder

We have not been focusing on the dress code so far this year as we have been dealing with other priorities as students have transitioned back to full time school. It is time, however, to make sure everyone is reminded of the dress code. We ask families to review this with their students and help us ensure students are following it while at school. The dress code is outlined in the <u>student handbook</u> and shared below.

Dress Code

Clothing, including jewelry and other accessories, is expected to be appropriate for the learning environment. It should strengthen school spirit and pride and focus attention upon learning and away from distractions. Immodest clothing is not acceptable.

- Clothing that openly exposes a student's back, midriff, rear end, chest hair, shoulders, bra straps, or underwear is unacceptable.
- Tank tops are acceptable with straps wide enough to cover undergarments.
- Sheer shirts that reveal a student's back, midriff, chest hair, shoulders, or underwear are not acceptable.
- Length of skirts and shorts must provide appropriate coverage.
- Clothing, including face coverings, advertising, depicting, featuring, or referring to alcohol, tobacco, weaponry, violence, drugs or profanity is not allowed. Racist, sexist, or otherwise harassing material is also not allowed.
- Clothing that causes disruption to the learning environment is not allowed. School administration reserves the right to determine whether clothing is disruptive.
- Clothing that presents a safety concern, such as shoes with wheels in the soles, high heels or large
 chains on clothing or worn around the neck, or that causes maintenance problems, such as cleats,
 shoes that scratch floors, are not allowed.

After-School Detentions

We now have an after-school supervisor and will be bringing detention back as a disciplinary consequence. Students who are tardy unexcused to school will be given one-hour detentions after every third tardy. Students will receive detention for other behavior as determined by administration. Two- and three-hour detentions will be assigned for students who do not change their behavior. Detentions will be held regularly on Tuesdays and Thursdays and at other times when necessary. Parents will be notified about detention by phone or email at least the day before.

Calendar Reminder-April

Reminder there April 28 and 29 are our Celebration of Learning Days.

- > Seniors only need to be in school to present at their scheduled time on their scheduled day.
- > Juniors are scheduled to be in school on one day and have a remote learning plan on the other day.
- > **Sophomores** will be in school on their scheduled presentation day and do not need to be in school on the other day.
- > Freshmen are scheduled to be in school on one day and have a remote learning plan on the other day.

From the Counselors' Corner...

<u>Early College</u> - This is a great option for students looking to challenge themselves more or to take classes that we don't offer. Each student in grades 10-12, as well as 2nd semester 9th graders, can access tuition and fee free college classes (provided they meet the prerequisites). Any student can contact their school counselor to talk more about options at both the University of Maine system and the ME Community College system, as well as Husson and St. Joseph's, for early college classes. SATs or ACTs? - many juniors are asking us about standardized testing for this spring. PRHS will not be hosting a test day. The SATs/ACTs have become optional at MANY colleges since covid. Students really need to figure out for themselves if they want to take the test or if they need to take the test. Spring dates for SATs are May 7, 2022 (Deadline to register is April 8) and Jun 4, 2022 (Deadline is May 5). Spring dates for ACTs are June 11, 2022 (deadline is May 6) and July 16, 2022 (deadline is June 17)

NWEAs will be the spring state test for all 3rd year high school students. We will be scheduling those for May. We will also have all 3rd year students take the state science test during that time. More information will be coming.

AP EXAMS are coming as well in May! These will be paper and pencil tests this year. The schedule is as follows:

Spring is here! And we are playing ball! Let's stay on the field. Parents, please have conversations with your kids about eligibility, they should be able to tell you what it takes to stay eligible. Also, have conversations with them about prohibited behaviors such as substance use including alcohol, tobacco, and vape.

Athletes must be in school, on time, and good citizens to be eligible to play

It is important that student-athletes understand there is an increased level of commitment to their athletic team(s) at the high school level.

- > Good behavior is a prerequisite for participation. Be a good teammate and citizen. Student athletes jeopardize their opportunities when absent, or sent out of class. Our kids are student-athletes and that requires being good students and good citizens.
- ➤ Attendance: Students must be in school and remain in school for the entirety of the school day in order to participate in athletics that day. Exceptions may be granted by the Co-Curricular Director or other school administrator for a documented appointment during school, a religious holiday, family emergency, or for any extenuating circumstances. Individual coaches may have additional rules or stipulations regarding attendance at practices to prepare for competitive events.
- > School Detention/Suspension: Students who are suspended, in school or out of school, are not allowed to participate in any team-related activities, including but not limited to practices and competitions. Students that are sent to the office out of class for disciplinary reasons may be held out of practice or competition at the discretion of the school administration.
 - Attending all practices, games, and team activities is mandatory. After-school detentions must be served
 when scheduled. Skipping detention will jeopardize the athlete's eligibility to participate. Suspensions
 and detentions are unexcused absences from team activities.

If you missed the **One-act presentation of The Great Gatsby**, you missed a chance to see our theatrical kids bring it on stage. For the One Act Play Festival, the Great Gatsby was condensed into a 40 minute performance. Several students shined in this one including Mason Brousseau, Audrey Fryda, Anna Bretler, Li'Sha Powell and Brady Martin. Stay tuned for the spring musical.
