Learning Plan for Quarantined Students

Any time a student must quarantine because they are a close contact, PRHS teachers will be sure to send students work through Google Classroom. This is updated regularly and students should be able to keep up with missed work. Students can email teachers for help on any assignments.

LUNCH AND APPLICATIONS

Why are we asking all families to complete the Meal Application Form if meals are no charge?

The family income data provided by the application informs key funding for school resources. This includes school meal reimbursements, funding for Title I programs, funding and resources for afterschool programs, State subsidy, funding for special education, teacher loan forgiveness.

How can I complete the Meal Benefit Application? The <u>COMPLETELY CONFIDENTIAL</u> application is available to print, complete and return to your school or you can complete the online form at <u>www.SchoolLunchApp.com</u>. If you have difficulty accessing either of these methods, the form can also be sent home with a student...just contact your school's office to make the request. From the Counselors' Corner...

This school year is certainly off and running FAST! The counselors are working hard to catch up with seniors; help students settle into classes, schedules, and 5 days a week, as well as address the continued issues around the pandemic.

<u>PSATs</u> will be held on <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>October 13</u> here at PRHS. This was offered as an option for all juniors and sophomores. Any students who did not sign up originally can still be added to the waitlist in the Guidance Office.

All **3rd year students** (juniors) will be taking the **NWEAs** this fall in their English and Science classes. We will not be disrupting the school day schedule, nor will this impact LRTC. The dates for testing are **October 21 and October 22**, with make up testing to follow. NWEAs will also be held in the spring for this group as well. This is the required state testing and a PRHS graduation requirement.

<u>COLLEGE VISITS</u> - We have welcomed in person visits at PRHS for college representatives willing to travel to us. The <u>calendar</u> of those colleges is linked and students can sign up from that page. This is a great opportunity for a student to put themselves in front of a college of interest and get questions answered. We also encourage all students and families to see what the options are to visit campuses in person. This is a very important part of choosing a college. These visits are open to all students in grades 9-12 - it is never too early to start!

<u>SENIORS</u> - get your Senior Appointments done so that you can have more help as you start working on those post-PRHS plans. Email your counselor or Mrs. Carter to get those set up.

To SAT or not? *This is a great question for our seniors. Most colleges have gone test optional for THIS ADMISSIONS CYCLE (meaning that this can change next year); however, any student needs to check with each individual college to see if any testing is required. SATs are good for up to 5 years, so any student really has to weigh out their future plans and also consider scholarships, NCAA, and other programs that may need SATs.

*PRHS will not be hosting any SATs for the 2021-2022 school year.

<u>FINANCIAL AID</u> - October 1 is the date that both the FAFSA and CSS Profile become available. We now have our own personalized <u>PRHS Financial Aid video</u> for senior parents (thank you to PRHS parent Jessica Whittier!) that you can watch over and over. <u>FAME</u> has a wealth of resources, including <u>Virtual FAFSA Help Sessions</u> this month. Please reach out to your student's school counselor if you have any questions.

SENIOR FAMILIES who want MORE help with the FAFSA will be able to sign up for personal help sessions on **November 16** via zoom with Jessica Whittier from FAME. Watch your email for more information about how to sign up!

ON THE SPOT ADMISSIONS is available for seniors with the following colleges:

University of Southern Maine - November 12 8:00 AM - 2:00 PM
University of Maine - November 18 8:00 AM - 2:00 PM
Central Maine Community College - December 17 9:00 AM - 2:00 PM

Sign up is in the Guidance Office. Seniors submit their application electronically at least 2 weeks prior to the event. Each senior has a 15 minute "appointment" with the representative from the college. The representative will have previewed the application, so that they can review the chances for admission and scholarships with the student.

This pandemic continues to take its toll on each and every one of us. We can see how it has impacted students who return to 5 days a week after 18 months of online and hybrid learning. Health Office Updates

We encourage all students to either get vaccinated or participate in Pooled Testing to avoid being quarantined! To get started, please fill out the consent form with your permission to perform a COVID-19 pooled test for your student at Poland Regional High School. This process should take no more than 5 minutes to complete using a computer or a smartphone.

- 1. First, click here (https://testcenter.concentricbyginkgo.com/minor-consent).
- 2. Then, enter this access code: **U4HX9Y**
- 3. Finally, enter your child's information, and you're done!


Note: If you need to provide consent for more than one child, please complete the process once for each child.

Pooled testing does not provide individual results for each person in a pool. However, if a positive result is produced in a pooled test, all individuals of the positive pool will have a free follow up diagnostic test at school. At PRHS, the diagnostic follow-up test that will be used is the Abbott BinaxNow which is a rapid COVID-19 antigen test. All diagnostic test results are confidential and will be shared with only the individual and guardian. As required, we report all diagnostic test results to the Maine CDC.
