#### From the Counselors' Corner...

Mud season, warmer weather, sap flowing, ice out, birds around - must be spring in Maine! Quarter 4 has started this week, so we are on the downhill slide to the end of the school year.

JUNIOR FAMILIES QUESTION & ANSWER "NIGHT" will be Monday, April 12 at 6:00 PM with the high school counselors and Jessica Whittier from FAME. A comprehensive newsletter was sent (via email) to all junior families about senior year and the college admissions process, including financial aid information. This is the follow up Zoom meeting to answer any questions that PRHS junior families might have.

**JUNIOR APPOINTMENTS** have started. Each junior will spend at least 20 minutes with their school counselor this quarter to go over their graduation requirements, courses for next year, and post -PRHS plans. This is a RT requirement.

**JUNIOR MEETINGS** have changed in these covid times. The high school counselors have started weekly emails and videos for the Class of 2022 to give them important information and provide support as they consider careers, military or college. You can find the weekly updates <a href="here">here</a> on the Junior page of the PRHS Guidance website. This means that parents can review the materials as well. These updates will continue into April. FAME has many free online <a href="information sessions">information sessions</a> still on how to pay for college.

**COLLEGE FAIR** - Typically we would take the entire junior class to the Augusta Civic Center in May for the in-person NEACAC College Fair. Options this spring instead are <u>virtual fairs</u> offered with live sessions on April 14 and May 16 through the New England Association of College Admissions Counseling. Students get registered There are many other fairs offered that we will post <u>here</u> on the PRHS Guidance webpage.

**SENIORS** - get those FAFSAs done! Any seniors considering college for next year should submit their Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) no later than May 1. There are still many supports for senior families on how to navigate the financial aid process provided by FAME (Finance Authority of Maine). FAME has many <u>videos</u> as well as their own <u>You Tube channel</u>.

**AP EXAMS** will be in a different format (many are digital) and at later dates this year. Here is the schedule of dates and times that we will be hosting AP exams at PRHS -

#### **Health Office Updates**

#### COVID-19 Update:

Over the last 30 days, the rate of new cases for school staff or students is 30 per 10,000, about 25 percent lower than a new case rate of 41 per 10,000 for the general population. This continues to demonstrate that in-person learning in schools that follow public health precautions can be conducted safely, without increased transmission of COVID-19, and supports schools' adherence to the six requirements for returning to in-person instruction, regardless of their county's designation.

The Maine CDC expanded its vaccine eligibility guidelines last week to include Mainers age 50 and older. Here is the website for current <u>Maine Vaccination-sites</u> for eligible people to schedule a vaccine appointment. Also, this week, **the State of Maine created a website for Mainers age 16 and up to pre-register for the COVID-19 vaccine.** If you are eligible or awaiting eligibility for vaccination, you may pre-register at <u>VaccinateME.Maine.gov</u> to be notified when appointments are available. When a vaccination appointment becomes available to you, you'll receive an email with a personal access code that allows you to look for available openings across a number of sites and schedule an appointment.

Please notify the school nurse if your child receives a COVID-19 vaccine as it is important to maintain up to date immunization records of all students. Once your child is fully vaccinated (two weeks after 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of Moderna or Pfizer, and two weeks after Johnson & Johnson) with the COVID-19 vaccine, a quarantine period is not required if identified as a close contact as long as your child does not have symptoms.

Despite an increase in Mainers who are fully vaccinated, we continue to see about 200 new COVID cases each day over the past week. Please continue to follow precautions when you are around others outside your household: cover your nose and mouth with a mask, practice social distancing, and wash hands regularly. It's been a long year, but the sooner we knock this virus down the sooner we can resume our normal lives.

#### New Immunization Law for the 2021/2022 School Year:


A new Maine law will take effect on September 1, 2021 that removes the philosophical and religious exemptions for students. The only exception to these changes is for students with an Individualized Education Program(IEP) and an exemption in place prior to September 1, 2021. If your child has a medical exemption on file, it is required to provide yearly medical documentation for this type of exemption. If your student is either non-immunized or immunizations are not up to date, letters were mailed home over the past couple of weeks.

Beginning September 1, 2021 no child will be permitted to attend school without medical or IEP exemption, evidence of immunization, or proof of immunity against disease. Students enrolled in grades PreK through 12 are to be immunized against diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, measles, mumps, rubella, polio and varicella. Additionally, all students enrolled in grades 7-12 must be immunized against meningococcal disease. Since it takes time to complete the immunization series, this is the time to call your child's primary care provider to set up a schedule to start receiving vaccines if your child is going to be able to attend the first day of school this fall. We encourage you to reach out to your health care provider to develop a plan for vaccine administration, or discussion of medical exemption, so your child is compliant and ready to start school next fall.
