TRANSPORTATION:

Training secessions have been conducted for three Wednesdays in April. Railroad crossing safety, air brakes, safe load and unloading of students, and workplace civility (SP: D.2.b) are some of the topics to be covered.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICER

The Androscoggin County Sheriff Department has provided a proposal for law enforcement service which contains a draft MOU and budget outline. The Operation Committee is currently reviewing the proposal.

FACILITIES: During April vacation, E.C. Berry & Son swept and removed the winter sand from the school parking lots and roadways.

Independent Roof Services has been hired to perform a comprehensive visual roof inspection and non-destructive moisture survey at PRHS. A written report on the general condition with a recommendation expected in June.

We have scheduled the Alternative Sentencing Program for June 22th to June 29th. This is the program in which the Androscoggin County Jail provides free labor for public schools. A list of projects is currently being compiled and will include tasks such as painting and cleaning.

NorthLights Electric has been hired to convert 31 PRHS parking lot light poles to LED. A 120 watt LED bulb will replace a 400-watt metal halide lamp. Expected electrical savings is \$3,500/year.
